# Winter School 2021




Since the Summer School 2020 had to be cancelled WTMC offered a very successful Winter School on January 10-14, as fully online event, with 36 participants. Anchor teacher Pierre-Benoit Joly (INRA/IFRIS/LISIS, France) reflected on a "New Political Sociology of Science". Why is it necessary to (re)politicize STS? What does it mean? What are the implications from a methodological and epistemological standpoint?

Other teachers were Ismael Rafols (UL, CWTS), Melanie Peters (Rathenau Institute), Soraya Boudia (Univ. of Paris) and Johan Schot (UU).

# **Spring Workshop 2021**

The online-workshop dealt with "Datafying non-humans". Over the last forty years, scientific endeavours and related policy initiatives have been strongly shaped by datafication. Many of these current endeavours, whether space exploration, genomics or addressing climate change rely on complex digital objects, formed by global networks of data flow. By approaching related datafication practices from an STS perspective, the 31 workshop participants examined social, cultural and political aspects that have shaped the digital production of knowledge related to scientific research since the second half of the twentieth century.



Teachers were Tahani Nadim (Humboldt-University Berlin), Claire Waterton (Lancaster University), Christine L. Borgman (UCLA), David Ribes (University of Washington), Sharif Islam (Data Architect DiSSCo), and Clemens Driessen (Wageningen University).

#### **Summer School 2021**



Also our online-Summer School (August 23 – 27) was a great success. Anchor teacher <u>Sergio Sismondo</u>. The school deliberated on "Epistemic Corruption". Knowledge production is associated with particular values and standards (truth, objectivity, impartiality, etc), and failure to conform to these are often prominently condemned as corruption of the scientific endeavour. The 28 participants examined epistemic corruption as closely related to issues of social order, especially social order within knowledge-producing communities, but also social order in knowledge-consuming communities. The school programme will be published in the WTMC

Series soon.

The Fall Workshop on "Innovation Studies" will be held from 3 till 5 November 2021 at <u>Soeterbeeck</u>. This WTMC PhD Workshop is an event for *WTMC participants in the first instance*. If less than 20 WTMC PhDs



register the remaining places could be filled by external PhDs. Teachers and PhD researchers will consider the tradition of studying emerging technologies and innovation systems, which has historically been very strong in the Netherlands.
